Although celiac disease is common, it is greatly under-diagnosed due to a lack of familiarity with modern diagnostic algorithms. Left undiagnosed and untreated, celiac disease can lead to further complications such as osteoporosis, infertility, other autoimmune disorders, and cancer.

Entitled “*Celiac CME Central: Defining, Diagnosing, and Managing Celiac Disease*,” this evidence-based, interactive program features a faculty of three celiac experts and can be found online at [www.CeliacCMECentral.com](http://www.CeliacCMECentral.com). The activity defines celiac and the spectrum of gluten sensitivity, explains the gluten-free diet, features patient case studies, includes comprehensive resources available for immediate download, and offers an ‘Ask the Expert’ section.

This web-based educational initiative enables ready access to key disease information, including dietary tools and support resources that care providers can use with their patients today. The enduring *Celiac CME Central* activity was developed using the combined competencies acquired by years of experience in celiac disease awareness-building and continuing medical education, and
