Current Priorities

The Coalition maintains a robust, year-round schedule of work. New projects are introduced during our monthly meetings, ensuring members can actively contribute to project design and execution, keeping all efforts aligned with the Coalition's core priorities.

As decided by the Coalition, the primary objective for 2026-2027 is to conduct a workshop with the FDA. During this workshop we will discuss lessons learned from past trials, celiac disease across the lifespan, and considerations for pediatric clinical trial design.

Structure and funding

The Coalition is operated solely by annual membership dues paid by industry members.
